Handed by *Interessengemeinschaft Seezeichen* to Association pour la sauvegarde du phare de Cordouan in June 2013.



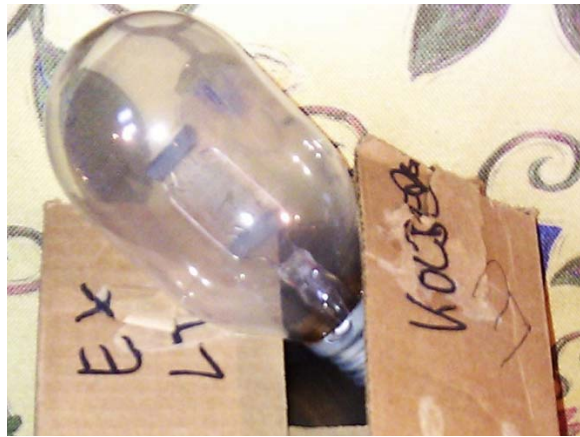
Kołobrzeg (Kolberg)



Rozewie (Rixhöft)

Handed to IGSZ in August 2008 by Polish waterways administration,
in: Kołobrzeg (German name: Kolberg), close to border to Germany,
lighthouse C 2906 (54° 11' N, 015° 33' E), Baltic Sea.

This type of bulb is presently very common in many Polish Lighthouses.



Handed to IGSZ in September 2009 by Latvian waterways administration, in: Daugavgriva (German name: Dünamünde), close to Riga, lighthouse C 3526 (57° 03'6 N, 024° 01'3 E), Gulf of Riga.

This lamp was very common in most parts of the Soviet Union until about 1990.



Westerheversand

Xenon Short Arc - handed to IGSZ in June 2013 by producer OSRAM; de-pressured. Used in various German lighthouses like Alte Weser, Westerheversand, Wangerooge, Helgoland.

Pressure cold: about 8 bar (0,8 MPa)

pressure in operation: up to 70 bar (7 MPa).
